<p>Before financial aid can be disbursed, you must also complete the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Admissions - In order to be eligible to receive financial aid you must complete the admissions process and be admitted to a certificate or degree program by 5:00 pm., Friday, the first week of class for the term in which you want to receive aid. 2) Transcripts - If you are a transfer student, you must also submit grade transcripts from all previously attended post-secondary institutions to the Admissions Office before financial aid can be disbursed.
